The Development Pathways Krystle Kabare Scholarship programme offers an annual academic Scholarship to a Kenyan graduate student with disabilities at The University of Nairobi, in memory of the late Krystle Kabare.



About the Scholarship

Before her untimely passing, Krystle was working as a Social Policy Specialist at Development Pathways in Kenya. She was passionate about improving the lives of the most vulnerable members of society, with a strong interest in **promoting the rights of persons with disabilities.**

As a celebration of Krystle's life, Development Pathways is awarding a **full Scholarship to a prospective Master's degree student**, within the fields of: Public Health, Anthropology, Economics, Sociology, Social Statistics or relevant field. We are also offering the opportunity to intern in our Kenya office.



Who was Krystle Kabare?

Krystle Kabare was a gifted student who excelled in her studies. She was awarded a scholarship to study in Atlanta, Georgia (USA) for her high school education, and attained a degree in Sociology and Anthropology in the USA before rounding out her academic achievements with a Master of Science in Peace and Development Studies in Sweden.

In her career, she worked for HelpAge International and later at Development Pathways Kenya, where she developed a passion for human rights and development, with a focus on helping persons with disability while working as a Social Policy Specialist.



Are you eligible?

Scholarship eligibility:

To be considered for the Krystle Kabare Scholarship, you must:

- Be a Kenyan citizen living with a disability
- Have already attained an undergraduate Upper Second-Class Honours Degree or above
- Be proficient in spoken and written English
- Have an acceptance letter to a Master's programme at The University of Nairobi for September 2022

The Scholarship programme does not discriminate based on age, race, colour, sex or religion

The Scholarship is not open to Development Pathways employees, consultants or family members

- An undergraduate certificate showing that the applicant has an Upper Second-Class degree or above
- Proof of admission into a Master's degree programme



- Two letters of reference (at least one academic)
 - Proof of Kenyan citizenship
 - Certification from the National Council of Persons with Disabilities (NCPWD)

Guidelines for applying

Development Pathways will notify the successful candidate in due course.

Upon receiving confirmation, a formal acceptance via email, as well as an official certificate of good conduct from the Directorate of Criminal Investigations, will be required to confirm the Scholarship.

Due to the anticipated high volume of applications we expect to receive, we are unable to provide feedback to unsuccessful candidates.



Guidelines for applying

During the academic term, the candidate must meet the following rules:



- Take the full number of units per semester to qualify as a full-time Master's student.



- Enrol on time and adhere to the academic calendar, with the year commencing in September 2022.



- Maintain a mean grade of 'B' at the end of each semester.



- The recipient will be required to write a blog/article/report on their learning experience throughout the scholarship and internship, which will be published on the Development Pathways website.

If the student defers enrolment beyond one year, the Scholarship will be null and void.



Financial support

The scholarship will cover:



- Full coverage of Course tuition fees, paid directly to the University Study
- Related charges (including medical, library, activity, caution fees, computer lab fees, student I.D.) up to a maximum of KES 32,750 per year



- Book allowance, up to a maximum of KES 20,000 per year
- Funds for the purchase of a computer up to a maximum of KES 60,000.



- Research and Examination allowance of up to a maximum of KES 60,000
 - Certificate of good conduct of KES 1,000 per year
 - A monthly stipend of KES 10,000 for living expenses
